Canadian author Jill Culiner will speak about her book, *Finding Home: In the Footsteps of the Jewish Fusgeyers*, about a little known story in Jewish history. Nearly 70,000 “Fusgeyers”—Yiddish for “wayfarers”—fled persecution in Romania in the early 1900s, walking through Romania in small groups, while earning their living by giving theatrical performances, until they were able to emigrate to the New World. Culiner retraced their journey, walking herself through Romania, and picking up their trail through Budapest, Vienna, Frankfurt, Rotterdam, London, and Liverpool to the cities in the United States and Canada, where many settled.

Culiner is a professional photographer as well as an author, and her book includes both her contemporary photographs as well as archival prints. She lives in Toronto and also in Tiszaors, Hungary, where she is working on a book about the Hungarian Holocaust.
