What do you do with all your records, documents, photographs, collection of anecdotes, and, above all, your family tree? How do you compile and display it for other family members and for yourself?

In this lecture, Kastner will show how to create inexpensive family books on one's own computer, in very small quantities, using software that most of us already have.

Merle Kastner is a charter member of the Jewish Genealogical Society of Montreal and is currently Program & Publicity Chairman. She also serves on the Board of Directors of the Baron de Hirsch Cemetery association. She has been researching her family roots in Romania, Poland, Moldova, Lithuania, and Belarus since 1993. Merle publishes and presents on a variety of genealogical topics and has created a number of family history books for various branches of her family.
