Beyond Search: Advanced Google Tools for Genealogists

Last year Mr. Marx presented advanced search techniques to make your Google searches more relevant and more efficient. His current talk continues the “advanced Googling” theme and introduces other features and tools that Google offers to aid your genealogy research. For example, he will demonstrate how to: find pictures and maps of your ancestral town, use Google Language Tools to deal with foreign-language documents, connect with other researchers with similar interests, find unique resource materials that can be downloaded at no cost, and use some of the new tools and finding aids coming out of Google Labs that allow you to customize Google to your specific interests.

Michael has been researching his German roots since 2001 and can now trace his ancestors back to the mid-1600s. Much of his success has come from using the Internet, and his primary tool has been Google. He is also the treasurer of the JGSGB.

This event will include a short annual meeting of the Society with the election of officers and directors for the coming year.
