This talk will present creative solutions and problem-solving ideas for genealogy researchers interested in getting organized, so they can free up mental and physical space for more research. Miller will discuss clutter: how it happens and what to do about it. She will explain how to organize files, documents, photographs, correspondence, research projects, and research materials. In a lively and entertaining talk, she will also cover methods of approaching a genealogy project and how to plan for a research trip.

Rhoda Miller, vice president of the Jewish Genealogical Society of Long Island, is a Certified Genealogical Record Searcher and has lectured and volunteered widely on genealogy in the New York City area and at international genealogy conferences. She is a doctoral candidate conducting research on the relationship of family history and the retention and persistence of first generation college students. She also teaches a family history course at Dowling College in Oakdale, New York.
