Stephen Morse will take us on his exciting PowerPoint journey. Steve's One-Step website started out as an aid for finding passengers in the Ellis Island database. Shortly afterwards, he expanded it to help with searching in the 1930 census. Over the years it has continued to evolve and today includes over 100 web-based tools divided into twelve separate categories ranging from genealogical searches to astronomical calculations to last-minute bidding on eBay. Steven Morse's presentation will describe the range of tools available and give the highlights of each one.

Stephen Morse, the amateur genealogist, has received both the Outstanding Contribution Award and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the International Association of Jewish Genealogical Societies. In his other life, Steve is a computer professional who has spent a career alternately doing research, development, teaching, consulting, and writing. He is best known as the designer of the Intel 8086 microprocessor (grandfather of today's Pentium processor), which sparked the PC revolution twenty years ago. He has a Ph.D. in electrical engineering and still enjoys tinkering with electronics in his spare time.
