The Photo Archives at the U. S. Holocaust Memorial Museum have some 80,000 historic images documenting not only the tragic events of the Holocaust but also Jewish life in the decades before and after the war. While some of these photographs come from large well-known archival collections, many are the only remaining photographs of an individual family. Through the collection of private family photographs, the Museum both memorializes individual victims and also documents historic events.

Judith Cohen, who is the director of the photographic reference collection of the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, will show how examining both large and small photo collections in the Museum's archives helps to deepen our understanding of the historic record.
