Judy Izenberg and Jay Sage, two members of JGSGB, will share their experiences in planning family reunions. After carrying out the research to identify and locate family members, it is a great joy to meet them face to face. If you've never planned a reunion, it can seem like a daunting task, but if you plan ahead, it can be a wonderful experience both for you and for your relatives. The speakers will cover both the general principles of running a reunion and also some of the details, such as designing name tags and producing wall-size family trees.

Izenberg, who is currently a co-president of the JGSGB, has been doing research since 2000 and helped a friend plan a reunion in 2002. Sage, a past co-president of JGSGB, has been doing research since 1996 and organized the genealogical part of a family reunion held in August 2000.

Directions to Gann Academy: Take Route 128/95 to Exit 28 east. Follow Trapelo Road 2.3 mi. east (toward Belmont) and turn right onto Forest Street. The entrance to Gann Academy is 0.4 mi. further down the road on the left. From the east, take Trapelo Road to Forest St., which is the 3rd street on the left past the National Archives.
