Award-winning historian, curator, and author, Ellen Smith, will talk about the periods of immigration into Boston from various parts of the world as well as the movements of Jews within the Boston area.

Smith co-edited *The Jews of Boston* (updated in 2005) and was chief advisor to the Emmy Award-winning WGBH television documentary of the same name. She is the historical consultant for the proposed East Boston museum about the Mystic River Jews, at one time the largest group of Jews in Boston.

The speaker is collecting items relating to Jewish life in Chelsea, East Boston, Everett, Malden, Revere, or Winthrop. If you have any materials that you would be willing to contribute, please bring photocopies (not originals) to the meeting.
