Henry Wellisch escaped in 1940 from Vienna, where he was born. Over 20 years ago he began to investigate his family background, and he has concentrated his research on the Austro-Hungarian Empire, tracing his family back into the 18<sup>th</sup> century.

He has published numerous articles, including the section on Austria for the *Avotaynu Guide to Jewish Genealogy*, and has presented lectures to various genealogical groups, including international IAJGS conferences. He served as president of the JGS of Canada from 1993 to 1998.
